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SO WHAT'S AN ANNUAL REVIEW?

Those of you who have seen or read the last newsletter will be aware that I wrote a little piece about the School Travel Plan (STP) document; what it is, how to create one and how to

maintain it. I hope that you found the brief information useful, especially if you are new to our Jambusters site and the world of school travel planning.

This month, as promised I will be recapping the purpose of the Annual Reviews and how these differ from (and in fact compliment) the STPs. In fact, this is an article that even you veterans of travel planning may even find useful! So often, when I visit schools, the staff are super surprised to find that keeping the STP up to date is so much easier than they thought! So, the School Travel Plan; This is the primary document a school would be able to present or refer to, should any person's make an enquiry about the travel issues, the actions the school is taking to overcome these and how the school promotes active and sustainable transport.

The annual review process enables schools to update key information, such as changes to facilities that encourage active travel methods and difficulties that the school is facing regarding transportation/road safety. It also offers an opportunity for schools to shout about any initiatives or ideas that have worked 15th September deadline. At this stage well to encourage modal shift away from single occupancy car journeys.

In completing a brief annual review you are maintaining the school travel plan without having to re-write an entire document each year in order to ensure its validity. In fact, when the reviews are completed annually, a school would not necessarily need to renew their STP for at least 5years! The review can be completed easily via your school's Jambusters profile and you can even save as you go enabling you to pop in and out of it at times that suit you.

Ultimately, the Annual Reviews can save you A LOT of time and it provides a useful tool for your school to monitor its progress and efforts in ensuring you provide a safe environment that can support and encourage families to choose active and sustainable transport methods for their school run.
