Just a reminder - we (KCC) have toolkits suitable for both Primary and Secondary School to use. We have found that safer parking messages are best received when this comes from the children to the wider school community. And whilst some Primary schools may not feel comfortable with their pupils discussing the dangers of irresponsible parking with those adults at drop off or collection time, you can of course use the resources as awareness raising efforts if that would better suit the needs and aims of the school.

As for our Secondary Schools, this "Responsible Parking Squad" toolkit does include 5x FREE "RPS" Hoodies. For this type of initiative, we have found that once again, schools report that drivers have been hugely responsive and have demonstrated great parking behaviour changes when the Squad members have engaged directly with these parents and provide educational information and alternative collection/drop off points. Capital Grant Funding The closing date for the Capital Grant Funding Applications has been extended by one week. This means that schools now have until 5pm on Friday 16th June 2017 to submit the annual review and grant application via the Jambusters site.
